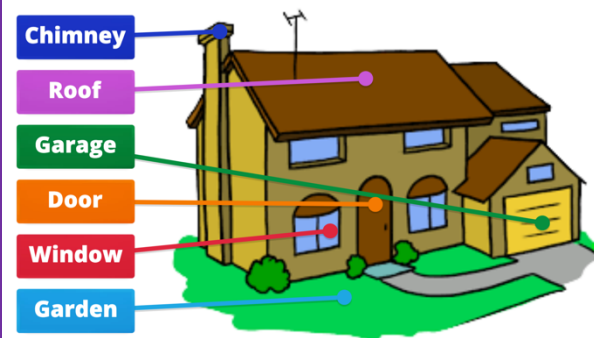
What should I know from prior learning?

Important Facts



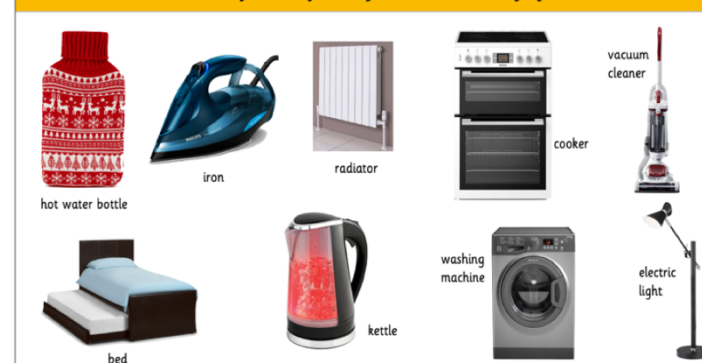
- The parts of a house
