

What should I know from prior learning?	Important Facts	Key Vocabulary
<p>Children should know about the conditions experienced by workers from the time of the industrial revolution (Y4, T1)</p> <p>Children should know about the abolition of the slave trade (Y5, T1)</p>	<p>- To know about the Ancient Greek Empire and its expansion from 750BC to 325BC – particularly under the rule of Alexander the Great.</p> <p>- To know about the different periods during the Greek Empire – <b>Archaic (800BC-500BC), Classical (500BC-323BC) and Hellenistic (323BC-146BC)</b> period.</p> <p>- To know Athenian Democracy was the start of a democratic system.</p> <p>- To know that <b>democracy</b> is a system in which the population of a territory has some power in the way in which the territory is run, and that this approach is still used today.</p> <p>- To know that <b>civil rights</b> are guarantees of equal protections and social opportunities under the law of a given society or nation regardless of a person's race, religion, gender or any other characteristics; civil rights are an essential components of a democracy.</p> <p>- To know that <b>human rights</b> are the guarantees of equal protections and social opportunities that are deemed to be a person's birth right regardless of the place in which they live.</p> <p>- To know that <b>reforms</b> were introduced to change conditions for workers and access to education in England in the early 19<sup>th</sup> Century.</p> <p>- To know that because of the work of the <b>Suffragists</b> and the <b>Suffragettes</b> in <b>1928</b> women were allowed to vote on the same terms as men.</p> <p>- To know that Martin Luther King Jr was an American civil rights icon who led the campaign for <b>equality</b> in America during the 1950s and 1960s, advocating peaceful protest and proclaiming the shared value and dignity of all people.</p> <p>- To know about the work of Nelson Mandela in bringing about the removal of <b>apartheid</b> in South Africa in 1990.</p>	<p><b>Democracy</b> The word democracy describes a form of government. In a democracy the people have a say in how the government is run.</p> <p><b>Reform</b> A reform is designed to make things better.</p> <p><b>Equality</b> Equality means recognising and responding fairly to the individual needs and identities of all others. It provides everyone with an opportunity to reach their full potential and have an equal chance to live their life as they choose.</p> <p><b>Apartheid</b> Apartheid was a system for keeping white people and non-whites separated in South Africa.</p>
